> Dr. Sise is the Trauma Medical Director at Scripps Mercy Hospital in San Diego, California. He attended the College of Holy Cross, the University of Rochester School of Medicine, and obtained his surgical training at Naval Medical Center, San Diego.

> Dr. Sise is board certified in surgery, vascular surgery, and surgical critical care. He was Chief Surgeon aboard the U.S.S. Guam and U.S.S. Iwo Jima with the amphibious assault forces in the Persian Gulf during operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm in 1990 and 1991. He completed a 20 year career as a Naval Medical Officer in 1992.

Dr. Sise is a Clinical Professor of Surgery at the UCSD School of Medicine and a senior faculty member and past Associate Program director of the General Surgery Residency Program of Naval Medical Center San Diego. He is a immediate past Chair of the American College of Surgeons Committee on Trauma Prevention Subcommittee. He lectures frequently on topics related to trauma acute care surgery, vascular surgery, and quality improvement at numerous regional and national medical symposia.

Dr. Sise and his wife and colleague Beth, who is a nurse and an attorney, have received numerous awards for their work in violence, injury and substance abuse prevention. Married in 1976, they have one son, Robert, who is a medical student at the University of California San Francisco School of Medicine






Gary Bryant requested President Richard acknowledge him as he had something important to say.
